* What does 'F1' mean? An F1 hybrid is the result of breeding two different strains of a variety to produce a third variety, bringing forward the desired characteristics of the parent varieties. The term 'F1' stands for Filial 1. F1 hybrids are developed and bred conventionally—not through genetic modification. Seeds saved from F1 varieties will not bear true to the parent.
